





VOLUNTEER DEPUTY REGISTRAR

What are the Qualifications?

To be appointed a Volunteer Deputy Registrar (VDR), a person must:

- 1. Be at least 18 years old;
- 2. Be a United States citizen
- 3. Not have been determined by a final judgement of the court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
 - a. Totally mentally incapacitated; or
 - b. Partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
- 4. Not have been finally convicted of a felony, or, if convicted must have:
 - a. Fully discharged from the sentence, including any term of incarceration, parole, or supervision; or
 - b. Been pardoned or otherwise released from resulting disability to vote
- 5. Not have been finally convicted of identity theft under Section 32.51 of the Penal Code; and
- 6. Be a Texas Resident

What are the duties of a volunteer deputy registrar?

A VDR may distribute and accept a voter registration application form from any resident of Comanche County and distribute and accept application from voters who wish to change or correct information on his/her voter registration certificate.

What is the length of appointment?

You may be appointed at any time during the year. Volunteer Deputy Registrar's appointments expire on December 31 of every even numbered year.

How do I get training for becoming a volunteer deputy registrar?
